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<p>Topic 2: CNA Data Dive: Core Course Completion (A Three Year Comparative Analysis 2023-2025)</p>	<p>Purpose and Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Review results of core course completion rate. ● Evaluate metrics and outcomes of completion percentage for a three year span. ● Analyze possible reasons for improvements and declinment of percentages. <hr/> <p>Summary of Key Discussion Points</p> <p>Goal 1: Increase completion of core courses throughout grade levels. Most percentages dropped in 2024 but proceeded to increase for 2025 especially in math where the percentage went from 5.9% to 6.8%.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Offer Additional academic support ● More Small Group Instruction ● Purchase and provide new platforms for students to work like LYLA <p>Goal 2: Support specific target groups like SPED and foster youth students to complete core classes since their percentage went from 9.6% in 2023 to 4.0% in 2025 in</p>

- Offer more academic support
- More one on one teaching
- Provide guidance to SPED students who may struggle in class settings
- Hire AT1 with science background

Goal 3: Continue to support ELL and specifically LTEL students who have excelled over the three year span going from 7.4% completion rate to 10.2%

- Offer iLit and ALD courses
- More Small group instruction
- Additional individual instruction with ELL specialist

Goal 4: Continue to spend budget money in four key categories; professional development, small group instruction, experiential learning and benchmark assessments. Spending is on track for goals 1, 2 and 3 for the mid-point mark.

Decisions Made:

- Continue current improvement of core course completion rates amongst subgroups by offering additional academic support, offering more small group and one on one instruction, and offering learning platforms that are accessible for students.
- Focus on target groups who

Goal 2: Present College and Career readiness performance data where we are overperforming.

- Graduation rate is currently at 52% when baseline is 41%.
- College and Career readiness stats are at 13% when baseline is 9.5.

Goal 3: Present College and Career performance data where we are underperforming

- Students with disabilities graduation rates are currently below our baseline.
- The objective is to improve SWD graduation rates and increase readiness indicators.

Goal 4: Present data and budget that shows we are investing in access and opportunity for all students

Goal 5: Present RENSTAR data and intervention strategies.

- Give data on RENSTAR math growth which we reached. Target growth was 1.0GLE and we were at 1.01GLE.
- Present RENSTAR ELA growth. Target was 1.54 and we are currently at 3.30.
- Maintain reclassification rates of at or over 20%.
- Discuss MY Math Path and My Reading Path and their effectiveness helping our

students achieve their goals.

Goal 6: Discuss suspension rates, chronic absenteeism, and dropout rates.

- We have an excellent suspension rate of .10% which is under the 1.5% target.
- Discuss what constitutes chronic absenteeism and how we nearly met goals for our target groups.
- Present dropout rates for both high schools along with our baselines. The high school dropout rate is 2.4% which is below our baseline of 5%. The middle school dropout rate is slightly above our 2% baseline with a 2.3% drop out rate.

Decisions made:

- Continue to monitor the budget.
- Keep working on improving rates for college and career readiness.
- Improve RENSTAR scores across the board.
- Keep suspension rates, chronic absenteeism and drop out rates low.

Next Steps:

- Analyze budgets for
